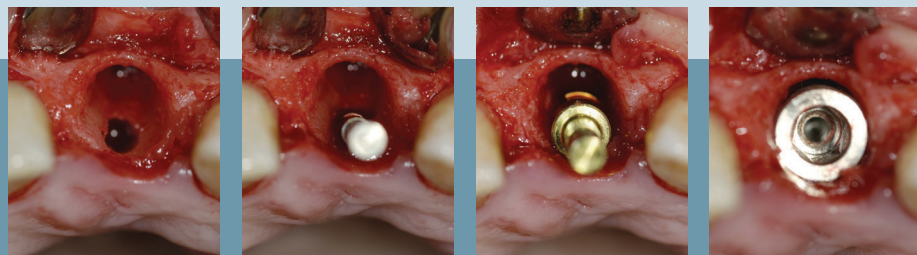

Dental implant placement and restoration as a single provider will allow the practitioner to meet the demands of the patient for successful, esthetically pleasing and naturally functioning tooth replacement.



Course Objectives

- Successfully utilize the most advanced and least invasive technique of tooth replacement
- Become successful at achieving prosthodontically favorable implant positioning utilizing emerging techniques including **Biaxial Implant Positioning**
- Reduce complications associated with malpositioned implants
- Increase auxiliary staff's level of comfort and competence in implant placement assistance
- Increase patient satisfaction by providing esthetically pleasing and functional solutions for missing teeth
- Increase patient satisfaction and increase practitioner success with single provider care practice management



Hands-on laboratory workshops will be located in the on-site 12 station professional laboratory.

This step-by-step course prepares the participant for implant dentistry in his practice. The final session will be devoted to placing implants in the patient provided by the individual participant. A patient may be provided for a participant for a fee subject to availability.
